



## What you need to know about RPI status

- From the date you apply for RPI status until the date you receive citizenship, you may not leave the US. If you cannot guarantee that you will not leave or be removed from the US during that time (a minimum of 10 years in some cases) **THIS BILL WILL NOT BENEFIT YOU.**
- You must be willing to submit biometric and biographic data with your application. You will be expected to resubmit this data every 3 years until your citizenship has been granted. If you do not want this information on file with the government –OR–you neglect to comply with this order **THIS BILL WILL NOT BENEFIT YOU.**
- You will be expected to pay any and all previous and current federal taxes. If you cannot afford to do so—OR—if you do not comply with this within 160 of your application **THIS BILL WILL NOT BENEFIT YOU.**
- You will be expected to pay a \$1000 application fee for RPI status. If you cannot or do not pay this fee, **THIS BILL WILL NOT BENEFIT YOU.**
- You must be able to prove and maintain employment which pays at 100% of the federal poverty level until you are granted citizenship. If you cannot do this or if you fail to do so, **THIS BILL WILL NOT BENEFIT YOU.**
- If you are unemployed for more than 60 days at a time, anytime will you have RPI status and are awaiting naturalization, your RPI status will be revoked and **THIS BILL WILL NOT BENEFIT YOU.**
- Please also be aware that your RPI status can be revoked at anytime that the Attorney General or DHS deems you (can't remember language, but something like a threat or uncontrollable or something) –OR–if you are convicted of a crime.
